On July 1, 2011 Bishop Mbarikiwa




submitted himself and his church to Bishop William I. McDuffie, International Presiding Bishop & Founder of Seed of Abraham

After being turned out by their land-lord, the members of Bishop-Designate Christopher Onkoba's church had no place to conduct services. There was no shelter from the elements for them when they met. If it rained, they were wet. If the dust blew, it covered them in a red sheen. In March of 2011, Seed of Abraham Christian Center International purchased a meeting tent as a temporary solution. Shortly thereafter, we began the process of building

them a new meeting structure by purchasing land. Taking on a building project in your own country is trying enough, let alone taking on one almost 10,000 miles away! It took a committee of 7 chairpeople with a Deacon as the chairman to accomplish this incredible project. October of 2011 marked the first service held in their new building! As people came through the door, they were greeted with a roof over their heads, seats, and a sheltered place to receive the Word to God.

Seed of Abraham Christian Center International was honored to build the first of many-to-come churches in East Africa. We are in fervent

expectancy to hear the testimonies of those that receive Jesus as their Lord because of the obedient work we have done!



Having a Bishop as their overseer gives them a spiritual covering they would not have otherwise had. We believe Psalm 2:8. The nations have been given to us as our inheritance, our personal property, and Seed of Abraham Christian Center International has chosen to claim

their inheritance! In 2011 we grew from 13 churches to over 172 churches in East Africa. We have strategic churches in Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania, each of them being re-designated as Seed of Abraham Christian Center-Kenya, Uganda, and Tanzania, respectively.

This is the year of growth and increase for Seed of Abraham Christian Center International. We serve a God who does the greater and we know that this year our claim on the nations for Christ will only expand!

For the 2011 Faith Conference where William J. McDuffie was consecrated as a bishop, Pastor Vincent Mbarikiwa from Seed of Abraham Christian Center-Tanzania was able to be present. Each of our 3 overseers in East Africa were invited



Called to ministry at a young age, William J. McDuffie was licensed in 1985, and subsequently ordained as a minister of the Gospel in the Church of God in Christ in 1988 under the auspices of Pastor Joseph W. Usry.

In 2001, under a mandate from the Lord, the Bishop established William McDuffie Ministries (WMM), Inc. which consists of several anointed ministries to include Seed of Abraham Christian Center International (SACCI) of Sierra Vista, Arizona. The mission of WMM and SACCI is to teach the Body of Christ how to submit to and effectively apply the Word of God (Truth), so that each member will experience success in every aspect of the abundant life.

Bishop McDuffie is married to the bride of his youth, Lady Yvette of Huntington, New York, who faithfully serves with him in ministry as Co-founder and Deputy Chief Overseer of WMM and SACCI. An adamant believer in covenant relationships, Bishop McDuffie is, at the same time, a spiritual son of the Most Reverend Doctor Richard B. Peoples.

Bishop McDuffie is a graduate of numerous highly technical courses and several military leadership schools to include the United States Army Sergeants Major Course and the United States Army First Sergeants Course. He holds an Associates of Applied Science degree in Electronic Technology from Cochise College of Sierra Vista, AZ, and a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Touro University International of Cypress, CA. In 2008, Bishop McDuffie graduated summa cum laude from Trident University (formerly Touro University) with a Masters of Science in Business Administration (MBA).

In August 2011, Bishop McDuffie accepted the ascendancy to the episcopal order and was consecrated as a Bishop in the Lord's Church by a College of Bishops on November 12, 2011. He was simultaneously installed as the International Presiding Bishop and Chief Overseer of Seed of Abraham Christian Center International, Incorporated.

Prior to becoming a spiritual son of Bishop McDuffie, God spoke to Pastor Mbarikiwa and told him that he would be going to America. Before he was even invited to attend our annual Faith Conference, God instructed him when to go get his visa; he was approved immediately at the Embassy and upon receiving our invitation, was prepared to come! That is the revelational knowledge of God at work!

Many indelible events took place for Pastor Mbarikiwa while he was here, the first of which is so notable that it must be given a few lines here to recount. Because the financial support that we send to our East African pastors is increase for them, they have always been encouraged to sow off of it. During the Sunday session of the Faith


Conference, Pastor Mbarikiwa was able to put a new type of action into his faith and sow a seed from his increase directly into Bishop McDuffie's hand. Hebrews 13:7 instructs us to imitate the faith of those who have led us. Pastor Mbarikiwa chose to imitate the faith of his spiritual father and he can get nothing less than the same results!

Throughout his time here, Pastor Mbarikiwa was able to fellowship with two of our elders and have afternoons of impartation from them. He was also gifted a brand new giant print NKJV bible, The Power of Your Words (E.W. Kenyon), and many audio teaching series. He will be able to take all of these materials back to Tanzania to continue his good work of ministering the Gospel. After attending our annual Faith Conference, seeing the wealth of our nation and ministry, Pastor Mbarikiwa's vision for his nation expanded. He believes that it will one day be so in Tanzania.









Driving Faith

As Bishop-Designate Robert Achwera drives down the dusty roads from town to town, village to village,

visiting each of the churches under his covering, people stop and stare. They're

curious. They take note. Why is a minister of the Gospel driving a car? How was he able to purchase one? All the minsters they've ever known have been too poor to own something so rare in East Africa...

This is a picture painted of what it may be like now that Bishop Achwera, our Jurisdictional Bishop of Uganda, owns a vehicle. Only 2% of the people living in the East African country of Uganda

never even seen one until they make the journey from their villages to the city. The thought of a preacher, who is generally among the

poorest, owning one, is quite foreign. Yet with the provisions

made by Seed of Abraham Christian Center International, Bishop Achwera was able to purchase a vehicle for ministry. He can now

visit the churches under him more readily and stay in closer contact with his spiritual sons.

Imagine making the journey from Phoenix, Arizona to Santa Fe, New Mexico. It almost seems illogical to consider going on foot with the various means of transportation at our disposal. Yet for many in Uganda, a journey

of such staggering proportions is simply a part of life. The distance from Phoenix to Santa Fe is close to the distance between all of the districts in Uganda where Bishop Achwera has churches.



Approximately 788 km (or 489 miles) spans these districts. Fourteen days is the given estimate of how long it would take to cross this distance on foot. Now Bishop Achwera can drive it in a mere day or two.

As people look on, some will simply see a car and move on. For others, they will see a man, who should be poor, prospering and be drawn. Drawn to his faith. Drawn to his God-given ministry.

Drawn to salvation. And so, as Bishop Achwera drives down the dusty roads, he is doing much more

than simply driving a vehicle to get from one place to the next, he is driving faith.

LAND WITH NO FISH OR BREAD

Drought has stricken this people before. It is no new thing to them. But this drought, it is different from the others. This drought has been called the worst in East Africa's living memory. Live stock are dying. People travel endless miles in search of water. Small children and the elderly are turned to skin and bones. Typically people seek assistance and relief from the government, but what should they do when the government has no relief to give? Where do they turn then?

Turn to the Church

In late 2011, Seed of Abraham Christian Center International gave over \$5000 in humanitarian aid and relief to those in Samburu, along with additional aid to those in Northern Kenya. This financial support, provided by our faithful partners, members, and the blessing of the Lord that makes us rich, served over 500 families. It purchased rice, flour, beans, milk,

water, onions, salt, and many other staples; it fed people that otherwise would not have eaten. People from the surrounding villages sought refuge and provisions at Seed of Abraham Christian Centre-Kenya instead of the local government.

In the district of Turkana in Northern Kenya and in the Samburu district, a region barely touched by the Gospel, many accepted Jesus as their Lord! Because their physical needs were met, they were able to receive spiritual food. Too many people from around the world look at the state of drought and civil unrest East Africa has been in and simply decided there was nothing they could do because they could not go. Everyday, the members of Seed of Abraham Christian Center

International have gone to East Africa with their financial support and faithful giving. They have fed a starving mother with beans and rice. nourished a desperate baby with milk, and most of all, given life to their starving spirits.


